**Senate Bill 533** addresses workplace violence, requiring virtually all California employers to:

- Develop, implement, and maintain a comprehensive plan aimed at preventing workplace violence.
- Conduct a thorough assessment focused on identifying potential workplace violence hazards within your operations.
- Examine incidents of workplace violence (broadly defined) and compile detailed investigation reports.
- Maintain detailed logs of violent incidents and threats.
- Deliver interactive training sessions for all employees as required.
- Retain and make available, upon request, records related to the workplace violence prevention program, adhering to specific retention periods.
